Bats in distress

What to do?

Have you come across a sick or injured bat?

Please do <u>not</u> try to care for the bats yourself. In almost all cases of disease or injury, only a specialist can help. Bats are wild animals with specific needs and require help from experts in their domain.

Please bring the patient to a bat shelter as soon as possible.

Proceed as follows:

- 1. Cut **3-4mm air holes into the lid** of a small box.
- 2. Fill up the box loosely with **crumpled paper towels or toilet paper** so that the bat can hide underneath it.
- 3. Take a **picture** from above. Make sure to **place a coin next to the patient**. This will help the specialist to determine the **size**, **type and age** of the bat. It also supports to get the patient to the best shelter and to take any necessary measures.
- 4. Handle the bat very carefully and place it inside the box. Use thick gloves (risk of injury!).
- 5. Close the box with **tape** or a rubber band. It must be **closed tightly** as bats can escape through tiny gaps!
- 6. Call the **emergency number** below to find out about the closest shelter.
- 7. Should the transport take **longer than 2 hours**, please put a **plastic bottle cap filled with water** inside the box.
- 8. Place the box in a quiet, cool and dark place until it is handed over.
